A One-Day Class with Judy Jeroy Saturday, October 19, 9 am to 4:30 pm

This beautiful butterfly will be worked with 6-strand cotton and rayon threads over Miracle Wire (DMC) and can be mounted on a satin box. The body of the butterfly will be made of beads with the antennae of the Miracle Wire. Judy is kitting this in **TWO COLOR COMBINATIONS**- **Blue/Green** (shown) or **Purple/Green** (see inside for color choices).

The stitches will be satin, buttonhole, stem, needle painting (long and short) and bead embroidery.

The kit will include linen twill to construct the butterfly wings, base mounting fabric, 6-strand cotton, 6-strand rayon, Miracle Wire, beads, needles, and instruction booklet for a cost of **\$25**.

Participants may also choose to purchase a **black or dark blue satin jewelry** box (6" \times 3" \times 2" high, with completed, finished interiors and a drop-in top suitable to carry the needlework) for a cost of **\$30** (this is in addition to the \$25 cost for the kit).

This course is suitable for all levels.








GCC Report - Barbara Fraize

As of October 2012, MAR membership was 1056. As of April 2013, MAR Membership is 1113 – a gain of 57 members! Welcome to all our new members.








MAR Chapter Challenge – Betsy Hanson

All chapters in the Mid-Atlantic Region are being challenged to create a unique needlework piece from materials they received at the Spring Region Meeting.





Each chapter that brings a completed project to the Fall meeting will receive \$10 as recognition of participation. The pieces will then be displayed and each attendee at the Fall SMART Day will vote for their favorite. The chapter whose piece receives the most votes will receive \$50 (in addition to the \$10 for participating in the challenge).

All completed pieces will belong to the region. They will be auctioned off in a silent auction at the Fall meeting. All of the money from the auction will go to the Joan Masterson Chapter Education Fund.

Gold Thread Award



It's not too late to nominate another EGA member for the Gold Thread Award. Each year one individual from each of the 13 EGA regions is selected to receive their region's prize. From this group a national winner is chosen. An individual, a group or a chapter may nominate someone they feel has given outstanding service to the art of embroidery.

The form is on the EGAUSA.org website (both on the welcome page and under Education/Awards). It can be filled in on-line or a letter with the needed information can be sent to EGA headquarters. **The deadline for submissions is May 1.** If you do nominate someone, please inform your Region Director (you do not have to indicate who you nominated, just that someone was nominated).

EGAUSA.org - AliceRae Kutish

EGA needed to replace our previous website because the platform needed to run the programs we needed was very out of date and unable to accommodate new technology. A firm, experienced with the needs of non-profit groups, was hired to create our new site. It is a work in progress and is being tweaked all the time to better fit our needs.

Members-Only Section

To sign on to the Members-Only section you now use your EGA membership number and a password that you choose. If you did not sign-in to the Members-Only section before January 1, 2013, you will need to contact Tonya Parks first. Tonya will verify your membership number and issue a temporary password. Once you are in the Members-Only section of the website you can enter a password of your choosing. There is a profile section under this heading, but no information, except what you have entered, is available.

Petite Projects

In the Members Only section you can find Petite Projects. There are currently 35 projects available, updated for current use and free to download; the rest are in the process of being updated. They are great for chapter programs or for individuals who are interested in a particular topic that their chapter may not cover.

<u>Forums</u>

Also in Members Only are the forums. Various topics, some of general interest, some more specific, are available. There is a Mid-Atlantic Region group but it has not been very active. At this time the forum topics cannot be delivered in a digest form to subscribers. This option is being explored.

The "Search" feature searches by title not individual word. So be as specific as you can when requesting a topic. I certainly am not tech savvy and change, while being difficult, can also be interesting if not exciting...so I encourage all members to try the new site. Set some time aside so that you can explore many topics and get comfortable with it.

What is the MAR PRIDE Scholarship?

Annually, the Mid-Atlantic Region offers scholarships through the MAR **PRiDe** (**Past Region Directors**) to members who desire to know more about an embroidery topic or increase technical skills.

Opportunities abound! A class, lecture, or special program related to your interest may be offered in your area or at a national or region seminar. Do you want to engage in independent study? Counted work, silk and gold, canvas, stumpwork, design, and developing your personal creative style are among EGA's independent study courses. EGA also offers certification in teaching, judging, and appraising needlework. Be aware that embroidery study experiences available from sources other than EGA may be funded by MAR **PRiDe**. Does a local historic property offer educational opportunities or have textile and embroidery holdings you might study, create records for, or for which you might research appropriate preservation methods? Is a travel opportunity centering on embroidery study available to you?

The deadline for applications is March 1 each year. Applications are reviewed by the selection committee consisting of three Past Region Directors (i.e., MAR PRiDe) and the recipients announced mid-March each year.

Scholarships are awarded in varying amounts. The recipient is required to complete the experience and write a report to the MAR PRiDe Committee two years from the time the recipient is announced.

The MAR **PRiD**e Scholarship Guidelines are available from your chapter representative and at www.marega.org, along with the application.

A call for entries will be in the December 2013 issue of the MARN. The goal of this scholarship is to enhance knowledge and experiences. Please spread the word to the motivated stitcher who may be able to share her enriched appreciation with the chapter because a MAR **PRiD**e Scholarship allowed her to learn more about embroidery.





Through the Needle's Eye - 20th National EGA Exhibit

Participation in the 20th National Exhibit is open to EGA members and the public. There will be two categories: Original and Adaptation. Using EGA definitions, an original work is one which, from the beginning, is solely the creative product of the stitcher. An adaptation is needlework inspired by or based upon a source other than needlework and modified through significant design changes.

The exhibit will be juried and judged by a panel of three judges, the names of whom will be announced in March 2013. Original needlework by EGA members will be eligible to receive the Diana Grossman Memorial Award. All needlework will be eligible for the Virginia Miller Contemporary Needlework Award and the Judge's Choice Awards.

In addition to the exhibit awards, the Mid-Atlantic Region is offering a \$150 award to a participating MAR member. The exhibit judges will determine the winner of this award, as well.

Entry packets must be post-marked by September 15, 2013, or earlier. The brochure, complete with guidelines and entry form, can be found on-line at www.egausa.org.

We know these events will provide MAR chapters with educational opportunities for their members and members of the region.






Thoughts on Flo Mellingar's Innovative Embellishments Class

I have been stitching for longer than I can remember. I have been a member of EGA for close to thirty years. This was only the third regional class I have participated in. It was wonderful!

Even before arriving in the classroom, via email, I had been encouraged by Flo to relax and anticipate the enjoyment of learning some new techniques without worrying about being judged. I must admit that over the years I have sometimes been intimidated by the high quality of the work of those around me and by the perceived expectations of excellence. This was plain fun, as well as mind-expanding, as we learned about needle felting and created lovely "felted stones" in just a short time; as we saw the magic effects of heat on Tyvek housewrap; as we carefully stretched fabric on frames and then gingerly began cutting threads and unweaving; as we used natural materials and found objects for printing on blueprint fabric, thanks to the brilliant sun of the morning.



Made possible by remaining funds from MARtians, this workshop was almost too short. I know that I would happily have continued to experiment with the techniques and would love to learn more tricks for embellishing my embroidery.

We really had a good time. The change of pace, the new learning, the relaxed and patient teacher, the interesting classmates – all made for an excellent experience.











A Constellation Chapter Challenge

For the past several years, the presidents of the Constellation Chapter have issued challenges to its members with the purpose of creating a fun year-long project, camaraderie among the members, and for some, to try their hand at an original design. A request was made to board members for challenge ideas - Jill Nedeau suggested a sort of linear project where each member's needlework would connect to those to the left and right of it. I took her idea and compressed it so it would be portable. This made it possible to carry the project board to our various meetings during the year. It could then be displayed in a glass case in our meeting room when it is not travelling.

A loop fabric covered foam core board was constructed with an 8 x 7 grid of blocks. The finished pieces of needlework were laced over 3" x 4" pieces of foam core and attached to the board with Velcro. Susan Elliott suggested using red for the thread, based on the Chinese proverb "The Red Thread."



Fifty six blocks were available to the one hundred seven members of our chapter. Forty-five members participated. Some blocks were not taken early on, so some of our members stitched more than one block.

For this challenge, members chose a pre-drawn block pattern with a line and perhaps a letter on it. The only rule was to stitch the line in red and the letter in black. The fabric used, design, and technique were completely up to the stitcher.

Participants were given a year to complete the block, and as the blocks were added to the board throughout the year, a "secret phrase" started to appear.

I chose a challenge end date to coincide with our Stitchers' Showcase. This is an annual event our chapter holds where members bring work they have completed and wish to share with the group. At this event, challenge prizes were awarded for the first block completed, most blocks completed by one person, and to those who guessed the secret phrase. There was also a members' choice award for the favorite block. One member observed that a popular theme seemed to be flowers and animals.

Jill Nedeau, who chose the first block (upper left corner), came up with the idea of showing many strands, coming together to create one thread. This was to represent many needleworkers coming together to complete this work. I chose the last block (lower right corner) and ended with a threaded needle. What came between was a wonderful variety of work by some very talented ladies. A few blocks still remain to be completed, and we look forward to seeing them as they are finished. We were not sure how the blocks would work visually side by side, with no planning, but we couldn't be more pleased with the result!

New MAR Banner


The new MAR banner is now with Huntingdon Chapter.

More than half of the 169 blocks have been stitched. Some are simple cross or Rhodes stitches. Others are elaborate (check out the breaching whales in the lower right).

Twenty-four chapters have signed up for a visit from the banner. Huntingdon is its 12th stop.

The banner's travel schedule is below.
