Deadline for all registrations and to receive the special Camp Wannastitch rate at the Clarion is December 15th. Please note this <u>date is firm and to be fair to everyone</u>, any registrations received after this date will be returned. Of course, registration will close sooner if we reach our limit of 174 people.

You can call the **Clarion directly at 800-638-2100** to make your room reservation. Double rooms are \$85 per night + tax. Each additional person in the room is \$15 per night. This special room rate will be honored until December 15th. There will be several other large groups at the hotel during our stay so it is highly recommended that you make your room reservations early. **Remember to ask for the Camp Wannastitch rate.**

Remember, even though the retreat runs from January 13-16, the stitching room will be available for our use starting at 4p on Thursday, January 12th. All stitchers who just can't wait until the 13th to start the fun, come on down and join us early!

Group Correspondence Courses



Isabella

OK, everyone, the suspense has ended and the Fall 2016 GCC winner is: *Isabella – Italian Drawn Thread*, designed and taught by Barbara Kershaw. 215 votes were cast overall, the largest turnout by far in my tenure as GCC Chair. Many thanks to all of you who voted!

This course continues your exploration of the wonderful technique of Italian style drawn thread. The project has been designed as a decorative hand towel but could easily be converted into a placemat, tablemat or even a table runner by using a longer piece of linen. There are six decorative bands across the towel three of which require withdrawing threads using two different methods. This course teaches the art of knotting bundles both in a straight line and in a curving line that undulates across the band. A simple dove's eye pattern is worked in band two on the straight lacing while a needlewoven fan pattern is worked between the undulating knotted threads of band six. Although this is an advanced level course, if you are familiar with withdrawing threads and want to explore and expand your knowledge and ability it is an ideal place to start.

Left-handed instructions are available on request.

Teacher: Barbara Kershaw

Project: Ornamental Hand Towel or Table Runner **Size**: Approximately 12" x 191/4" (30.5cm x 49cm)

Proficiency Level: Advanced

Prerequisites: A knowledge of drawn thread would be advantageous.

Time: Six-lesson course estimated to take six months. Left-handed instructions are available upon request.

Fee: \$175 per group

Text: \$47 per student (Text: \$42 + Postage \$5.00); 46 pages with three pages of color photographs and

one large chart.

Supplies (approximate): \$35 (estimate); Supplies used include 32-count Belfast linen, white Coton

Perlé™, white cotton floss

****The following supply list is furnished as an example of the materials required for this course. **EGA strongly suggests** that materials not be ordered or purchased prior to receipt of the text so that options may be exercised and supply orders or purchases combined.****

- 1 piece of white 32 count Belfast® Linen cut 18" x 24" (46cm x 61cm)
- 1 ball DMC ® white Coton Perlé TM #12
- 1 ball DMC ® white Coton Perlé TM #8 (optional)
- 1 skein DMC ® white six strand floss (optional, for use with #8 Coton Perle TM)
- #24 & #26 tapestry needles
- #26 chenille needle (sharp)
- Doodle cloth linen matching the count of your choice for the towel
