Schedule for Saturday, October 4 is: Class: 9:00 AM-Noon; Lunch Break: Noon-1:30; Class: 1:30-4:30 PM.

The Region is paying all costs for the class (room rental, tuition, and teacher expenses) except for the \$48.00 kit fee. **Student is responsible for: kit fee of \$48 plus the fabric: 10" by 12" piece of Cashel 28-count linen, Light Mocha** (or the color of your choice), **and DMC Variations Floss in color 4140**.

Upon confirmation of the class reservation, students will receive an email with instructions for completing the 2-3 hours of pre-work.

<u>Kit Fee: \$48</u> - will contain: Mill Hill beads and Crystal Treasures, Caron Collections thread, beading thread, beading needles, sharp needles and 2 colors of sewing thread for making the berries, as well as the project booklet including color photos, instructions and stitch diagrams.

Linda Suter Winner of the Carol Williams MAR PRiDe Scholarship

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MAR PRIDe SCHOLARSHIP

The 2014 MAR PRiDe Carol Williams Memorial Scholarship, was awarded to **Linda**, **Suter** of the Winchester Chapter. Linda will use the funds provided to study Ukrainian embroidery. She was hoping to travel there this summer but recent events have caused a postponement of her trip.

Each year individuals have the opportunity to request funds for embroidery study from the MAR PRiDe fund. This fund is sponsored by previous MAR Region Directors (hence the name). Some suggested uses are taking a class, going to a seminar, investigating a particular technique, etc.

The 2014 MAR PRiDe scholarship was named for Carol Williams of the Colonial West Jersey Chapter. Carol was a gifted a designer, stitcher, and teacher. There were no applicants by the deadline of March 31, 2014. The committee agreed to an extension until April 15 so that the opportunity could be stressed at the March MAR meeting. Linda Suter of the Winchester Chapter requested \$450.00 for studying Ukrainian embroidery techniques. Her request was granted. She will use the money to purchase resource materials such as books and items stitched with these techniques. Funds will be distributed in increments of \$100.00 as she submits receipts.

The MAR PRiDe scholarship for 2015 will be named for Jane Campbell of the Philadelphia Chapter. Jane was a prolific stitcher. Many of her items were displayed at the Golden Threads 2014 Mini. The deadline for 2015 will be March 31. It is not too early to start thinking about what stitching opportunity you would like to apply for. An application form will be in the January 2015 MARN and on the MAR website.

October 3, 2014 – March 29, 2015

Morven, New Jersey's Cultural Museum, is hosting a landmark exhibition to be the first to focus on the important contribution of New Jersey in the creation of schoolgirl needlework in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. With over 150 works on view, this exhibition will undertake the first survey of schoolgirl needlework completed in the state or by New Jersey girls prior to 1860. This exhibition and accompanying catalogue will create a lasting record of the best known examples. As part of the museum's mission to showcase the cultural heritage of the Garden State, the curators will bring new light to the needlework done in New Jersey during this important period of American history.
